THE RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

In the life of the Church, Lent sneaks up very quickly after Christmas. It seems like one minute we were having a season of joy and getting together- a time of celebrating that the ultimate joy, Christ the Lord, has entered into our world and into our human midst. Right after, the Season of Lent fast approaches. Why? Cannot the joy continue?

But in Lent, there is also joy. This is because Lent is an opportunity for us, as the Lord invites us into a time of repentance, renewal, and growth. The ultimate point of those three things is so that we experience the transformative power of God's love. Lent is a journey to the Cross, but it is only that journey because of the love of a God who goes to the Cross.

Since God created the first people, people have experienced the transformative power of God's love in countless ways. In the history of the Church, many men and women have experienced the love of the Cross in countless ways. These people are called saints. Contrary to some understandings, the Anglican understanding of a saint is one who has been on the receiving end of that love. They are people whose growth in the ways of God came through a renewal that could not come from their own strength, but from God's. This renewal was born out of repentance: an honest reflection of themselves and admittance of their need for God. These were men and women who when faced with life's trials, ran to the loving arms of God in order to draw their strength.

You may be familiar with the Episcopal publisher Forward Movement. This is the group that puts out Forward Day-by-Day, a booklet of daily devotions and meditations that we carry here at St. Michael's. Forward Movement also does something during Lent that is both fun and educational called 'Lent Madness'. It combines the elements of a March Madness type of sports bracket with an exploration of the lives of saints. All during Lent, one saint is pitted against another in a "battle for the saints", and you can go on the Lent Madness website (or follow them on Facebook) to vote for which one you prefer. You read a brief bio of each one and pick one. I don't like to look at it as which one is "better" (after all, the life of a saint is seeking glory for him or herself). I typically vote for the one who I resonate most with. Every year Lent Madness has a different set of saints from various periods of history (for instance, this year the contestants range from Andrew the fisherman to composer William Byrd), and the finalist gets a 'Golden Halo'.






