# THE RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

If you had to guess how many weeks that the average person's lifespan consists of, what number would you guess? That is what author Oliver Burkeman asked a random sample of individuals, and their guesses were all over the place. One person even gave a number in six figures. But the average lifespan, if you do the math, is about 4,000 weeks. That may seem like a lot, or it may not. For me, it didn't seem like a

lot, nor did it to St. Michael's member Harriet Green who told me about this book.

Time is precious. There have likely been many days that we've experienced where we felt there wasn't enough time in the day to focus on the people or things we have been meaning to give attention to. Something that Burkeman points out is that a lot of the amenities and inventions of the last 100 years that were meant, at least in part, to save us time actually cumulatively *fill up our time*. More and more in the last 15 years (let alone 100), the pace of our world and the options of things to do to fill our time with, have rapidly increased.

It may be helpful for all of us at some point to take a moment to reflect and ask ourselves "How did I spend my time?", whether we are in the later years of our lives or whether we are in the start or middle of our careers, raising families, etc. If you are the latter, picture your future self reflecting on this.

This isn't necessarily to make ourselves feel guilty. Rather, it's to cherish who and what we have now. Many of the things that dictate our time, we have no realistic control over. But time is still a gift from God. This January, Harriet will be teaching two classes on Sunday mornings for Adult Christian Ed (ages 16 and up) on how time is a gift. January 14 & 21 at 9:30 am.

We may be amazed at some of the things that we do find ourselves spending time with. Our life situations all differ, and I'm certainly no time management guru. But I am greatly looking forward to this class that Harriet plans to teach. I think it will benefit people at different stages of life, but especially for those with families at home.

What we can learn about time as God's gift, isn't so much about trying to squeeze in healthy or productive practices- there's plenty of things out there that tell us to do that. Rather, it's more about orientation and intentionality. God made and designed us for one another. Just as God is relational, his primary purpose is for us to be as well. Families are gifts, friends are gifts, our neighbors (which according to Jesus means anyone) are gifts, and we don't have an infinite number of moments with any one of them on this earth, not even the full 4,000 weeks. This class will be a good opportunity for our church family to come together in prayer and reflection, to discuss and share our own stories if we feel called to, to learn some interesting factoids about how society's relationship with time has changed over the years, and, importantly, to appreciate more fully the gift of time with God and how to share that gift with others.

St. Michael's **Godly Play** children made Advent wreaths together to remember that the four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday.




